## Livestock Judging

Ever wonder why the judge is placing a steer class the way they are? Why did you get 3<sup>rd</sup> with you lamb instead of 1<sup>st</sup>? Well livestock judging will teach you all of that, plus help you understand and talk like the judge too. Livestock judging is also valuable in helping you know and pick the best animals from the start so that you can have successful projects. If you are interested in learning about selecting quality beef, sheep, swine and even goats then take a try at livestock judging. Practices are starting soon with the first two being May 13<sup>th</sup> and May 19<sup>th</sup> at the 4-H office from 7-8:30pm. We will go over the basics and introduce youth to the principle of judging and oral reasons. ## Market Swine, Lamb and Goat Exhibitors - This is for You!

All exhibitors of market animals must obtain and fill out the Market Animal Registration Form and return it to the 4-H Office by May 28, 2010. This form is available on the 4-H website or by calling or emailing the 4-H Office. In addition, animals must be weighed in at the county weigh-in day on June 5, 2010. If you have any questions please call or email David Gordon.

## June 1st Deadlines Approaching!

June 1<sup>st</sup> is a very important day in 4-H and a deadline for a majority of our paperwork.

**Dog cards** - If you are carrying a 4-H dog project you need to turn in a Maryland 4-H Dog Identification card by June 1<sup>st</sup>. Without this card you will not be eligible to show at the Montgomery County Fair or Maryland State Fair.

**Horse cards** - If you are carrying a 4-H horse project you need to turn in the Maryland 4-H Horse and Pony Identification card by June 1<sup>st</sup>. Without this card you will not be eligible to show at the Montgomery County Fair or Maryland State Fair.

**Animal Leases** - The deadline for all lease paperwork is also June 1<sup>st</sup>. If you are leasing an animal as a project this year you must turn in all of the paperwork by June 1<sup>st</sup>. If we don't receive this paperwork on your animal you will not be allowed to exhibit them. Along with leases you also need to turn in identification forms if you are leasing a horse or a dog.

**Scholarships** - Scholarship applications for both Montgomery County and Maryland State 4-H Scholarships are due to either the county or state 4-H offices. If you are applying for a state scholarship, remember to leave time to have a Montgomery County Extension Educator review and sign your application. Don't leave it until the last minute - you might miss your deadline.

The Montgomery County 4-H Office, in cooperation with the Montgomery County Agriculture Center is working to develop a new, 30 minute Fair Exhibitor's Orientation for all 4-H animal exhibitors at the Montgomery County Fair. This orientation will cover valuable information including: The Fair Mission Statement, interacting with the public, animal welfare issues, self certification requirements and behavior and appearance expectations.

Many other fairs already have these types of orientation sessions and it was felt that we can improve communication by implementing one here. ***The orientation will be mandatory for all animal exhibitors and a parent or legal guardian to attend. Failure to attend one of these orientations will mean members will be ineligible to exhibit animal projects at the fair.***

The orientation will be offered following lunch at all four fair workdays (July 17, 24, 31 and Aug. 7). If for any reason you cannot make one of these workday sessions you must contact David Gordon at the 4-H office, (301) 590-2813 or [dgordon3@umd.edu](mailto:dgordon3@umd.edu) before July 17.

Volunteers and staff from Anne Arundel, Calvert, Charles, and St. Mary's Counties have been working hard to ensure that youth and volunteers who attend have a great time. The schedule includes
