Cancellation/Deadlines for County Programs

Due to recent circumstances, the Carroll County 4-H Team needs to address a problem regarding program registrations, fee payment and cancellations.

Our staff works very hard to offer a variety of programs, workshops and activities for Carroll County 4-Hers. We aim to have the dates and themes announced with plenty of time for families to sign up and plan accordingly. We also strive to keep the programs affordable. We appreciate that prices have gone up for various programs as supply prices have drastically increased. Shipping is also taking longer than before, which moves up our registration deadlines. Because of these challenges, we order supplies for a program the day after we close registration to ensure we have plenty of supplies at the best prices.

Therefore, we cannot add participants to these events following the deadline, and we cannot make exceptions. We appreciate your understanding.

Events that do not have a deadline for registration but have a maximum capacity regularly fill up quickly, and we do keep a waiting list. We understand that you may need to cancel your child's registration, and we ask that you do so within 5 days of the event. This allows us to reach out to families on the waiting list and offer them the opportunity to participate.

If you need to cancel after the 5-day cancellation window, **your family will be responsible for the cost of the supplies, and your family will be sent an invoice for the program.** We will also gladly set the supplies and directions aside for your child to pick up from the office and create the project at home at your convenience. Unfortunately, we have had so many unpaid invoices and last-minute cancellations that we are losing too much money to allow this to continue.

2026 Livestock Sale Requirement Update

An update to the requirements 4-Hers must meet in 2026 to be eligible for the 2026 Carroll County 4-H & FFA Fair Livestock Sale.:

“Junior exhibitors and Novice 4-H/FFA exhibitors of any age in any species are **REQUIRED** to participate in one of the following. All other 4-H/FFA exhibitors are encouraged to participate in one of the following:

A. Attend 4—Carroll County Dairy Bowl, 4-H Livestock Judging, 4-H Dairy Judging or Livestock Skillathon practices.

B. **Must attend a Carroll County 4-H sponsored livestock workshop for a species exhibitor is showing from this list:** Beef Field Day, Swine Workshop, Swine Field Day, Sheep Workshop, Meat Goat Workshops, Sheep and Goat Field Day, Junior Stock Show or these additional opportunities hosted through Carroll County Extension (livestock/dairy roundup, veterinary science experience). Additionally, Dairy Steer exhibitors may attend a Dairy Workshop.

C. Other livestock related events must be approved by the Department Committee of the type of Species and the livestock sale committee prior to participation.”

The wording that is bolded is the change in which 4-H members need to attend a workshop for a species they are showing and cannot attend a species workshop of something they are not weighing in.



Sheep Workshop

The 2026 Sheep Workshop will be held on Sunday, March 22nd at 1pm at Ripple Creek Farm in Hampstead, MD. An address will be sent out closer to the workshop. If you are planning to show market lambs at the 2026 Carroll County 4-H & FFA Fair, this is a great opportunity for some hands-on experience and to learn more about updates and changes to the sheep department. All juniors (8-10 years old) and novice exhibitors (1st year showing a market animal) must attend at least one livestock workshop for the species they are showing. CC 4-H Beef Classic

The Carroll County 4-H Beef Classic will be held on **Saturday, April 11th** at the **Carroll County Ag Center** (TRP Barn). We are excited to be hosting this event in Carroll County again this year. We will have classes for market beef, dairy steers and beef heifers as well as showmanship too! Registration forms were handed out at weigh in, but can also found attached to the online Tribune.

Meat Goat Workshop

The 2026 Meat Goat Workshop is scheduled for **Sunday, April 19th, 10am at Full Moon Farm** (4748 Full Moon Drive; Manchester, MD 21102). Important information will be shared out relating to the Meat Goat Department at the CC 4-H & FFA Fair. Sessions will also be provided with hands-on experience for 4-Hers too. All juniors (8-10 years old) and novice (1st year exhibitors) must attend at least 1 livestock workshop for a species they are showing to meet the CC 4-H & FFA Livestock Sale rules. Swine Weigh-In and Tagging

If you plan to exhibit Market Swine at the Carroll County 4-H & FFA Fair or Maryland State Fair, it must have a Maryland 4-H ear tag and be weighed in at the Carroll County 4-H Weigh-In. Market Swine Weigh-In will be held on **Friday, May 1st from 5-9pm at the Carroll County Ag Center (TRP Barn)**. You must turn in a completed 2-part Livestock Registration form to the Extension Office with the number of tags you will need. **Livestock Registration Forms are due to the Extension Office by April 24th.**

Remember **to fill in ALL information, including RFID tag numbers**. This helps us as your pigs come across the scales to match up to who owns the animal when there are multiple 4-Hers on one trailer. The Animal Science Code of Ethics will be on the reverse side and BOTH pages must be signed. There will be a total of 3 signatures for the 4-Her and 3 for the parent/guardian. **Tags cost \$2**. Checks can be made payable to CCEAB. You must register, tag and weigh-in the appropriate animal for Carroll County. You may not weigh-in your animals at another county and be eligible for the Carroll County 4-H/FFA Fair. Questions? Call 410-386-2760. **This is the only weigh in date for swine for Carroll County 4-H members!**

Castration Policy of the Maryland 4-H AnSc Program: All male steers, lambs, pigs and goats must be neutered and healed prior to 4-H weigh-in and tagging. The only exception would be animals that have obvious signs they have been banded, however, their scrotal sac is still intact.



Market Goat and Market Lamb Weigh-In/Commercial Goat-Lamb Tagging

If you plan to exhibit a Market Goat or Market Lamb at the Carroll County 4-H & FFA Fair or Maryland State Fair, it must have a Maryland 4-H ear tag and be weighed in at the Carroll County 4-H Weigh-In. Market Goat and Market Lamb Weigh-In will be held on **Friday, May 15th from 5-8pm at the Carroll County Ag Center (TRP Barn)**. You must turn in a completed 2-part Livestock Registration form to the Extension Office with the number of tags you will need. **If you are planning to show a market animal and a commercial breeding animal, they MUST be on 2 separate Livestock Registration Forms. Livestock Registration Forms are due to the Extension Office by May 8th. Remember to fill in ALL information, including Scrapie tag numbers. Having ALL information filled in helps the committees move through weigh-in quicker and helps match up animals when multiple 4-H members are on the same trailer.** The Animal Science Code of Ethics will be on the reverse side and BOTH pages must be signed. There will be a total of 3 signatures for the 4-Her and 3 for the parent/guardian. **Tags cost \$2.** Checks can be made payable to CCEAB. You must register, tag and weigh-in the appropriate animal for Carroll County. You may not weigh-in your animals at another county and be eligible for the Carroll County 4-H/FFA Fair. Questions? Call 410-386-2760. **This is the only weigh in date for Market Goats and Lambs for Carroll County 4-H members!**

Swine, Sheep and Goat 4-H Classic



Hold the date! We will have a new format for the Carroll County 4-H Swine, Sheep and Goat Classic on **Sunday, May 31st**. This year, we will be able to show in Shipley! **We will start in the morning with the swine show and will follow in the afternoon with the sheep and goat show.** More information will be provided as we get closer to the show. This will still be a show off your trailer show with some limited pens that families will be able to set up if needed.

Junior Stock Show

The 2026 Junior Stock Show will be held on **Saturday, June 27, 2026 at High Ridge Farm**. Remember, this is the last opportunity to meet the livestock sale workshop requirement if you still need one. More information and registration will be provided as we get closer to the June show.

Maryland State Fair—Rate of Gain

If you are planning to show in the market beef, sheep or swine shows at the Maryland State Fair an announcement was made in January through the Maryland State Fair Livestock Exhibitors Facebook page that there will be NO RATE OF GAIN requirement for the shows/sale starting in 2026 at the Maryland State Fair. Market Goat exhibitors - please note that there has not been ROG at the Maryland State Fair, therefore no changes on ROG for goats.

2026 Poultry Orientation

Poultry Exhibitors: **If you are planning to OR thinking about showing anything in the Poultry Department at the Carroll County 4-H & FFA Fair in 2026, you are REQUIRED to attend ONE of the orientation meetings.** This includes poultry, turkey, posters, eggs, clovers, etc. This also includes first year and returning exhibitors. These meetings are for the Poultry Department and do not meet any requirements for any other livestock department. The meetings are in person (no virtual meeting offered and no make up sessions offered). All meetings are at the Extension Office and begin at 7 p.m.— check the listing on the board for the room number.

There are 3 options to attend 1 meeting:

Tuesday, March 24

Wednesday, April 8th

Thursday, May 7th

Again, you need to attend only ONE of the meetings.

Reminder: If you showed in the Poultry Department in 2025, you are required to have completed a Poultry Project Record Sheet in order to show in 2026, so be sure you have completed that (clovers are exempt). Any questions, call or text Nancy Carlisle at 443-605-5134

Dairy Bowl Practices

It is time to start Dairy Bowl practices again! Remember, anyone who has an interest in learning more about the dairy industry can attend these practices. Practices will be held every **Tuesday** night starting on **February 3rd** through **April 7th** at **7 p.m.** at the Extension Office. Horse Safety Class

If you are a 1st year Horse Exhibitor, you are required to attend one of the horse safety classes offered to exhibit at the 2026 Carroll County 4-H & FFA Fair. Exhibitors will learn about horse safety, along with an orientation about what happens on show day at the fair and what you need to bring. **If you have not attended a horse safety class this year, you MUST attend the last class being offered on Monday, March 23rd at 7pm at the Extension Office.**



Horse Judging Practices

Let's dust off those notebooks and grab our boots! It's time for Horse Judging Practices to start! Any 4-H member (8 years old and older) can participate in horse judging. You will learn more about what to look for when looking at horses confirmation and performance. You do not have to own a horse to attend practices, just have an interest in learning more! **Horse Judging practices will be held on Wednesday evenings starting at 7pm. Practices will start on March 25th and the following week on April 1st will be held at the Carroll County Extension Office.** Then we will head off to farms throughout the area. The State 4-H Horse Judging Contest will be held on Saturday, June 13th at the Howard County Fairgrounds.

Dog Training Program

It's that time of year again to start thinking about participating in the 2026 Dog Training Program. **Registration for training classes will take place on April 9th, 6:30pm at the Extension Office.** Youth and parents will need to be present, along with a **copy** of your dog's rabies certificate and county dog license/tag to be left on file with the trainers. Dogs without a valid rabies certificate/county dog license WILL NOT be allowed to attend training classes. If the rabies certificate expires during training, you must bring the new certificate with you at the next possible training date. If you think you might be substituting a dog within the training classes, bring those certificates/licenses with you. Please take the time to register as many dogs as you think you may need through the training classes.

Additionally, on **April 20th there will be an initial Dog Evaluation Session in the Extension Office at 6:30pm.** The dog(s) the youth registered to train with will need to come and be evaluated as to their suitability. If a dog is deemed to not be suitable for this kind of training, it will be dismissed. A youth may substitute another dog for training, but it must be present on April 20th for the evaluation. The minimum age for dogs participating in this program is at least 6 months of age by May 5th. There will be no classes for clover-age youth.

Fees for this year: A \$30 fee is required for all Carroll County 4-H Members (Additional siblings in a family will be \$25). Payment will be accepted at the April 9th registration. The Carroll County 4-H Dog Care and Training Classes are open to Carroll County 4-H members ages 8-18. **The Training classes will be held on Tuesday evenings beginning May 5th** and will run most Tuesdays until the Fair.

NEW Rabbit Judging Program!

We are excited to announce the launch of a Rabbit Judging Program here in Carroll County. This program is for youth who want to learn more about show rabbits or who are interested in starting a serious breeding program. Participants will develop the skills needed to evaluate rabbits based on ARBA breed standards, body type, condition, and overall quality, similar to livestock judging. They will also learn breed identification and how to give oral reasons, explaining their decisions clearly and confidently, which builds public speaking, critical thinking, and decision-making skills.

What this program is:

- A hands-on learning experience where youth develop skills in evaluating rabbits and understanding what makes a high-quality animal.
- An opportunity to learn about rabbit breeds, conformation, health, wellness, and husbandry skills.
- Structured, educational, and fun, focused on growth, confidence, and becoming a knowledgeable judge of rabbit quality.
- Fully interactive, with active participation in judging exercises, discussions, and practice sessions.

What this program is not:

- This is not a 4-H club or club meeting.
- It is not a program for pet rabbits. This focus is on rabbits for show, exhibition, or serious breeding, working toward the ARBA Standard of Perfection.
- It is not a rabbit show or breeding program itself, though participants will learn about these topics.
- It is not a competition requiring top-quality, but the goal is learning to evaluate and judge quality.

The program is a great way for youth to develop expertise, confidence, and a deeper appreciation for rabbits as exhibition animals while gaining practical skills in judging and improving their own stock.

Rabbit Judging Practice Dates will all take place on the following Friday nights from 6:00—8:00pm at the Extension Office:

March 20th, April 17th, May 15th, July 10th

County Contest will be held on July 24th for state fair team selection.

Practices will then resume after the fair on the following dates:

August 7th, August 14th, August 28th and September 4th

4-H judging programs are open to all interested youth between the ages of 8-18 years old as of January 1, 2026.

Too many ribbons? Don't throw them away. If they are in **good** shape, drop them off at the Extension Office and we will recycle them for next year. Ribbons should not be wrinkled, written on or missing strings. We cannot accept State Fair ribbons.

Fair Fundraisers— The fair is currently holding several different types of fundraisers and they need the support of families to participate. Families who have previously exhibited at the fair received an email on February 23, 2025 with information on multiple fundraisers.

Notes from Miss Sandy (Red Building Departments) - The Carroll County 4-H & FFA Fair Executive Board met and planned a draft for the entering and judging of exhibits and contest for the 2026 Fair. In 2025, indoor judging had 4-Hers making several trips in a day to drop off their exhibits. For 2026, 4-Hers will be able to bring all of their items for the few departments that will be conducting the drop off judging all at the same time and will not need to make special trips for those departments.

We know it can be confusing when entering indoor exhibits. Departments in the red building have two types of entering and judging that you will see on the fair schedule. If the schedule shows a department with "entered and judged," this means conference judging will take place. If the fair schedule shows "entered," this means the exhibit will be dropped off and judged at a later time.

When departments are scheduled as "entered and judged," this is considered conference judging. These departments typically offer a 3-hour window for exhibits to be brought to the fairgrounds, entered and judged. 4-Hers will show their exhibit to the judges and explain their project and answer any questions from the judges. The judges will give a placing and the item will then be placed on display. The 4-Her will leave the judging table once all of their exhibits for the department/classes are judged. At the end of entering in these departments, the judges will then select all of the champion and special awards.

The second type of entry type is the "drop and go." On the schedule those departments will show as "entered". There will be a larger time frame on the schedule for exhibits to be dropped off in the red buildings. The exhibits will be checked in with Ambassadors or volunteers and placed in the correct judging area. Judges will come in after the drop off entry times to complete the judging and choose their champion and special awards. Exhibits will be displayed after the departments complete their judging.

NEW for 2026 is that indoor exhibits will have an early release on Friday (August 7th) between 9:00—10:00pm. There will still be the release time on Saturday morning as well and if you cannot make it to pick up your exhibits, arrange to have a friend or family member come and pick up your items. Remember, the buildings still have to be cleaned up on Saturday morning. If your family's last name is scheduled to be here on that Saturday, you should plan on being here. All indoor items need to be picked up by 11am on Saturday, August 8th.

Judging – March 28, 2026 – Judging will take place from 1-5pm (excluding Clovers) at the St Mary's UCC (1441 Mayberry Rd Westminster, MD 21158). A SignUp Genius will be emailed to participants for judging time. All participants need to return by 6:30pm for Fashion Show to take place at 7pm. Judging and fashion show will be held at St. Mary's UCC.

Mini Fashion Revue – Monday, August 3, 2026, time to be determined. Entries must be completed on line at www.carrollcountyfair.com.

RULES AND REGULATIONS –

1. Junior contestants (ages 8 to 10) may model only one outfit. Intermediate members (ages 11 to 13) may model two outfits – one from Constructed and one from Ready to Wear. Senior members (ages 14 to 18) may model two outfits, but no more than one outfit per class.
2. Participants must participate in both the Preliminary and On-Stage Judging portions of the event.
3. Senior champions will represent Carroll County at the Maryland State Fair. Intermediates and Juniors can model only at the Maryland State Fair. 4-H members are responsible to registering themselves into the Maryland State Contest by July 15th at www.marylandstatefair.com
4. Each participant will need to arrive between 3-5pm on June 10th for modeling/interviewing with the judges. Times will not be assigned and it's the responsibility of the participant to arrive during the judging time listed above.
5. All classes except Ready to Wear are constructed by the 4-Her using a sewing machine, hand stitching, weaving, knitting or crocheting. These garments are completed as part of the Sewing/Textiles unit. As in the past, the entire outfit does not have to be home constructed,

unless described as a requirement for the class. Construction is judged only as it affects the appearance of the outfit on the model.

6. Ready to Wear classes are garments constructed by a manufacturer. No home-constructed items may be entered in these classes. Garments do not have to be purchased new and can be altered. You are encouraged to follow class descriptions as you select the appropriate class for your entry.

7. Accessories do not need to be made by the contestant, but will be taken into consideration in judging the overall presentation of the outfit. Accessories must be easily worn or carried. No live animals or people as accessories.

8. No one will be permitted on stage or in the judging room area unless pre-entered in the County Fashion Revue event.

9. Age divisions are determined as of January 1 of the current year; Division A—Clover (5-7 years old) Division C—Intermediate (11-13 years old) Division B—Junior (8-10 years old) Division D—Senior (14-18 years old)

10. Two top 13 year olds will be selected by the judges to participate in the State Fashion Revue as an educational opportunity. They will model on stage at State Fashion Revue but will not compete for awards. Thirteen year olds participating at the Maryland State Fair will be identified the evening of the Carroll County 4-H Fashion Revue and is then the responsibility of the 4-H member to enter the state event by July 15th at www.marylandstatefair.com.

11. Champion and Reserve Champion will be selected in all classes in Senior Division only.

12. Intermediate and Junior participants will be judged on the Danish system.

13. There will be a Clover division during the County Fashion Revue. Clovers may model a purchased outfit, a handmade outfit, an item handed down, or a decorated outfit. Basically, a clover member may model anything they choose as long as it is appropriate for their age division. Clovers will also be able to participate in Mini Fashion Revue at County Fair. Clover-age participants in both Fashion Revue and Mini Fashion Revue will receive a participation award.

14. Any 4-H youth in a sewing/textiles or fashion revue project may participate in State Mini Fashion Revue and Mannequin Modeling by pre-entering on the State Fair form.

Dear Carroll County 4-H & FFA Beef Exhibitors:

We are excited to announce that we will be holding the Carroll County 4-H Beef Classic on **Saturday, April 11, 2026, at the Carroll County Ag Center in the TRP Barn**. We hope to see many of you come out to the show! As a reminder, if you are a junior or novice exhibitor you must attend at least 1 livestock workshop for a species you are showing to meet the requirement for the 2026 Carroll County 4-H & FFA Fair Livestock Sale. Participating in the 4-H Beef Classic would count as a livestock workshop. If you cannot attend the field day, please note that the Beef Workshop will be held on Sunday, February 8th at 1pm at the Extension Office.

Please read the important information below concerning Beef Field Day.

- You must be enrolled in the Carroll County 4-H Program or a Carroll County FFA Chapter to be eligible to participate in the Carroll 4-H Beef Classic.
- This will be a primarily show off trailer event. Limited stalls will be set up but are being held for our novice and junior members. Please make sure to check the box on the entry form if you are a new family and would like to stall inside of the barn.
- For 2026 we will be limiting each member to showing 2 animals in total at the 4-H Beef Classic.
- Please be sure to list 4-H tag number on the entry form for each steer, commercial heifer or market heifer you are entering. Make sure to include all information on purebred heifers (registration number, birth date, etc.).
- We will follow all Carroll County 4-H & FFA Fair Beef and Dairy Steer Department Rules for the show. Classes will be the same as listed in the beef department rules, with the exception of Dairy/Dairy Cross steers as they will all show together in 1 dairy steer show. Breeds for all shows will be broken based on numbers the day of the show.
- There will be no wash racks open for the field day. Plan to have your animals clipped and washed before arriving.
- There will be a \$15.00 entry fee per child for the Carroll 4-H Beef Field Day. This is to offset the cost of the judge, awards and other expenses. Please make checks payable to **Carroll County 4-H/FFA Fair** and **write in the memo line: 4-H Beef Classic**.
- **ALL ENTRIES NEED TO BE POSTMARKED BY APRIL 1, 2026.** Late entries will be accepted, but their will be an additional late entry you will need to pay \$10.00 per head to enter in addition to the \$15.00 per child fee.
- Please remember the guidelines concerning health papers. You must have your health papers for Beef Field Day & they will be checked. Please remember CVI/Health Forms are only good for 60 days. Please be sure to read the Maryland Department of Agriculture (MDA) guidelines regarding RFID tag requirements for cattle in 2026. You will also need to bring your health papers for your cattle. Please be sure to look at your animals and fill out the back of the health papers (self-certification) & sign them before you come to the show.

- Please do not bring any animals with ringworm or warts.
- Heifers - Commercial heifers, meaning they cannot be registered with a breed association the heifer must be tagged with a green 4-H ear tag. For heifers that can be registered, they must be tattooed & you must bring their registration papers. The tattoos need to be clean, clear, & legible.
- Remember all steers have to be registered & tattooed in order to show in the purebred divisions, otherwise they will be shown with the crossbreds. Bring your steer registration papers to the scales for them to be checked. Additionally, make sure your purebred animals are tattooed, and the ear has been cleaned so the tattoo can be read.
- This is a **NO FIT SHOW** like at the fair so you will not need any fitting supplies! Animals are to be washed and dried only.
- You **MUST** take your bedding home after the show, please bring a wheelbarrow. We do not have a way of disposing of any bedding or waste after the show.
- **If showing off your trailer – you MUST clean up your area prior to leaving. You are responsible for any electricity you may need. Generators are allowed at trailers.**
- There will be other activities going on at the fairgrounds that day, so please remember to be respectful of others. Park in the designated areas.
- After the show, please remember to make sure to clean up all areas and all help is appreciated to clean up the barn/show ring.
- Any additional information about the Beef Field Day will be emailed to families closer to the event.
