Bee Lab

Everything is still up in the air, so I can't predict what the longevity of operations at the lab will be, but we have a flexible interim plan that should be useful to everyone.

We will not use the hoop houses this year (no water or electricity installed)

- 1. We will convert pen 5 into seedling flats grow out area. Everyone can use this pen. It is late enough in the season that seedling plants will grow outside. We will set up automatic water for that pen.
- 2. The usual pens 1-4 will be available for grow out areas as usual. Any plants you have at my farm can be brought back and placed. The caveat is that if things get shut down you will have to grab your plants and move them out of there. In case the bee lab closes you can take your plants to my farm, and I will figure out how to water them without sucking all the water out of our well.

Workday Saturday from 10 AM - 2 PM We just got a delivery of soil today at the bee lab, but I don't believe we received seed starter. I will have to check. We will have to scavenge seed flats from the old pot piles at the lab or you can bring your own (which just be pots). We invite everyone to come and plant their seeds and our seeds which have been nicely stratifying in our frig. We probably will start Thursday workdays next week.

Native Orchid Tour

When: May 10th from 10AM - 1PM

Come see and learn about the beautiful, interesting native orchids growing on Maryland's Western Coastal Plain. Despite the unusual weather patterns this spring,

we hope to find several species in bloom, including showy orchid (Galearis spectabilis). Orchid expert Dr. Dennis Whigham will be our guide to these sometimes-elusive plants at the Smithsonian Environmental Research Center.

The ecology of plants has been Dennis' primary interest, and his research has resulted in journeys through forests, fields and wetlands around the world. Explorations have lead to studies of woodland herbs – including orchids, vines, wetland species, and invasive species, and studies of forests in the tropics, temperate and boreal zones. In recent years, studies of interactions between orchids and fungi have led in new and exciting directions. His current passion is to establish the North American Orchid Conservation Center (NAOCC), an initiative of the Smithsonian and the United States Botanic Garden. NAOCC will be based on continentally focused public-private collaborations that will result in the conservation of the genetic diversity of native orchids, initially in the U.S. and Canada.
