2025 4-H Broiler Show Results

Members of the Garrett County 4-H completed their 2025 Broiler Project with the Broiler Show on June 4th. Members are given 10 Cornish Cross peeps donated by Bruceton AG Service in Grantsville, MD. The members then raise the peeps for 8 weeks to a market size. At the end of the eight weeks, the youth turn in a report showing the feed conversion, mortality rate, and profit/loss from their project. They include pictures and a story where they tell what they learned from their project. The members are then allowed to sell the broilers for meat or keep them for their families.

The Broiler Project is a wonderful, short term learning experience for 4-H youth and their families. We greatly appreciate the support of Bruceton AG Service for the donation of the broiler peeps to the youth members. For 2025, we had 15 youth participate.







Maryland 4-H All Stars Induction





Caterpillars Reach Outbreak Levels in Tri-County



The Maryland Department of Agriculture has announced populations of spring hardwood defoliating caterpillars have reached outbreak levels in Garrett, Allegany, and Washington Counties, causing widespread leaf damage to hardwood trees, especially oaks. While trees are not dead, over the next few weeks affected trees will take a similar appearance to that of trees in the

winter. Areas in which defoliation will be most visible include near Grantsville and along the ridgetop of Meadow Mountain from Deep Creek Lake to Keyser's Ridge, extending north into Pennsylvania. For more information, read the press release below.

Bring a tomato to enter in the contest, taste different varieties, workshops to learn more about gardening, and choose new recipes! Free & fun for everyone!


CONTEST CATEGORIES:
