If your child is under 13 years old, a "parent account" is required to assist with monitoring your child's online activities.

Club Leaders can also sign up for CLOVER by 4-H and can view all of the content to find potential club activities and even manage multiple learner accounts for their clubs.

In addition, the very best part is that CLOVER by 4-H is free!

Volunteer at the Information Booths

The Information booth is a great way for 4-H'ers, 12 years old and up, to volunteer and start working toward their fair memberships or SSL hours. IN ADDITION, we need parents and other adults to help supervise.

We have four booths throughout the fair grounds. Teams of two to three people work each booth for a minimum of four-hour shifts. Shifts are 10:00 a.m. to 2:00 p.m., 2:00 to 6:00 p.m., and 6:00 to 10:00 p.m.

Friends and families can work together and entire clubs can sign up together if they want. We would like 4-H'ers to be in the booths while adults help by monitoring each booth and by visiting the booths at intervals and dropping off any needed information materials. Good public speaking is great, but an enthusiasm for the fair is all that is needed. In order to volunteer, you must

attend one of the orientation meetings. Clubs that want to sign up together may request to receive a training at one of their meetings.

Animal Exhibitor Orientation Required To Show!

All 4-H animal exhibitors (this includes ALL animals, even the pet show) at this year's Montgomery County Agricultural Fair will be required to attend an exhibitor orientation meeting.

Topics will update you on new rule and procedural changes for animals, public health, 4-H rules, fair policies, and other helpful tips to make sure you have a positive fair experience. The last session will be held at 8:30 a.m. sharp on August 2, in the Heritage Building at the fairgrounds. Doors will be closed promptly at 8:30 a.m. and no late entry will be allowed once the program begins.

Pet Show Requirement

The Pet Show is a super fun casual dress contest. Pets entered should be friendly and have no history of aggression.

ALL PET SHOW EXHIBITORS: The 4-H'er and a parent or guardian must attend one of the quality assurance meetings held in the Heritage building at 8:30 a.m. sharp. Last session is on August 2.

Please check the fair catalog for all requirements of pets entered in the pet show. All required identification and testing requirements/certificates for all species will be enforced the same as any other livestock event at the fair. This could be tattoos, RFD tags, etc.

Dogs and Cats MUST have a current rabies certificate at check in. Rabies tags will NOT be accepted as proof of current vaccine.

Please read the rules carefully for everything, including promotion. Pets shown in the pet show cannot be shown in any other fair event.

Rabbit Exhibitors

As per Maryland Department of Agriculture, all rabbits must be tattooed in the left ear for positive identification. This is a rule that must be enforced as animals in the pet show are subject to inspection and held to the same standards as all other livestock.

The Montgomery County Rabbit Club has generously offered free tattoo(s) for any rabbit(s) entered in the pet show on the last workday, August 2 in the morning. Please look for the Fair Veterinarian if your rabbit needs a tattoo.

Share at the Fair

Exhibiting your projects is one requirement for completing 4-H projects, and the fair is a great place to do just that! If you are enrolled in Montgomery County 4-H, or a 4-H afterschool program you are eligible to enter your exhibits in the 4-H Building or in any of the 4-H outdoor activities. Entering Your Work at The Fair

Once the fairground receives all 4-H entry registrations, they generate the display tags for each entry. Leaders will be notified when tags are ready to pick up.

Display tags must accompany each indoor entry at the fair. You must make an appointment to pick up your tags at the 4-H office. Alternatively, you can pick up

your tags at the Fairground on entry day. If you wish to volunteer to help sort tags, contact Jeannine Shriver at jshriver@umd.edu.

Exception to the July 20 pre-entries deadline. ONLY for Divisions 13-Vegetables and Fruits, 14-Flowers, and 15 – Agricultural Products. Pre-entry will not be a requirement for Divisions 13, 14, and 15 but are encouraged, before 20 July. This includes all vegetables, fruits, flower specimens, and agricultural products. We understand that the weather and other environmental factors play a vital role in these entries and their success. Because these factors make it difficult to know what your entries might be a month ahead of time, we encourage you to enter as many classes in these Divisions online. However, we will accept on-site entries in Divisions 13, 14, and 15 only.

Blank entry tags will be provided at check-in for divisions 13, 14, and 15. These items will be received on Saturday, August 10, from 3:00 to 6:00 p.m. as usual. Remember to arrive early to give our youth enough time to fill out their tags. Poster boards will be placed with a "how-to" fill out your tag information. In addition, volunteers will be stationed at the check-in table to help our youth fill their tags.

How to bring your indoor entries to the 4-H Building at the Fair Monday, August 4 – only day to enter club booths and banners, 6:00 to 8:00 p.m. Club books are optional on Monday.

Wednesday, August 6, 4-H non-perishable entry drop-off, <u>4:30</u> to 7:30 p.m. DOORS WILL BE CLOSED AT 7:30 PM. NO LATE DROP-OFFS WILL BE ACCEPTED!

Saturday, August 9, 4-H Perishable entry drop-off, 3:00 to 6:00 p.m. NO LATE DROP-OFFS WILL BE ACCEPTED AFTER 6:00 P.M.

Pick up day—Sunday, August 17 from 11:00 a.m. to 2:00 p.m.

All exhibits unclaimed by Sunday, August 17 at 2:00 p.m. will become the property of the fair. EXHIBITS WILL NOT BE TAKEN BACK TO THE 4-H OFFICE.

In addition, the Fair or the 4-H Office will NOT be responsible for any damage to an exhibit while at the fair.

Booths and Banners State Guidelines

Please remember, the <u>State Fair guidelines</u> for entering booths and banners are different from the Montgomery County Fair.

Banners: ALL clubs may enter their banners in the State Fair. However, Clubs must enter them themselves using the online State Fair entry system.

Booths: ONLY County Fair champion "State Fair Themed Booths" can be entered at the State Fair.

If you wish to enter your banner or booth, make sure it complies with the State Fair Catalog rules.

You are responsible for getting your booth or banner to and from the State Fair.

The 2025 State Fair Booth/Banner Theme can be found under "Department T - 4-H/FAA Promotion".

Banner dimensions: 50" wide X 38" tall. The opening for the pole should to be a minimum of 3", and is included in the overall size of 38" long. Do not bring your own pole. You MUST use these dimensions or you will be disqualified.

4-H Cake Auction Sunday, August 10

You are cordially invited, along with all of your friends and family, to join in the annual 4-H Cake Auction. The Cake Auction will take place in the Cattle Pavilion on Sunday, August 10 at 6:30 p.m.

Cakes that won blue ribbons at the fair will be auctioned off to the highest bidder—this is the main fundraiser for the Montgomery County 4-H Program. All money raised from the auction goes to Montgomery County 4-H to provide programs and opportunities for our 4-H youth and volunteers. Some of the things the funds are used for include resource materials, ribbons and awards, registration fees, and scholarships.

We need your support for the cake auction. Even if your child's cake is not in the auction, please join with friends and family to form a group to bid on a cake. If you know a business that would be interested in participating in this charity event, please encourage them to attend the auction on Sunday.


