This partnership included exploring the market potential for native wildflower sod in



the Mid-Atlantic through 100+ customer discovery interviews with growers, retailers, and landscape professionals. Lisa has also served as a high school teacher in Frederick, MD teaching all levels of chemistry and Advanced Placement environmental science. In her spare time, she loves going to concerts with her kids, helping her daughter at regional dressage shows, reading, and exploring the world. Reducing Runoff at the **Severna Park Farmer's Market Plant Clinic Garden**Slow it down, spread it out, soak it in*

*Using this mantra and the principles it supports, it is necessary to redirect the water from torrential downpours to prevent erosion of the property. Kim Forry has dug a trench around the perimeter to direct the rain. She has instructed us to either step in the trench to deepen it or over it, but not on the berm itself. The northwest corner is the worse spot due to the sandy soil in that area. We will improve the sandy soil with potting mix.

- In every garden, the weeds will grow! Black locust seedlings have begun to appear in addition to other troublesome volunteers. We invite all Plant Clinic volunteers to help keep the area clean of anything that may become troublesome.
- Our lovely dogwoods are showing signs of stress. We have contacted the Home and Garden <u>Ask Extension</u> with pictures and are waiting to hear back from them.
- We continue to need support watering the plants. Despite the rain, some of the material requires more water than what the rain supplies. For example, the trees require 5 gallons per week and the shrubs 3 gallons per week. Please consider helping with the watering.
