

This event is geared Clovers to Seniors and will have 3 mini workshops:



Have you ever felt overwhelmed by the needs of this world and wondered what you can do to learn more and help be a part of the solution?

Then we invite you to join our **4-H Global Food Champions Club** to explore issues related to global food security (gender, nutrition, agriculture, etc), learn practical steps you can take to help, and get involved with a community of others who care. This virtual club is for 4-H youth in Maryland grades 9-12. We'll meet via Zoom on **Nov 17**, **Dec 1**, **and Dec 15 from 6:30–7:30 PM**, with an **optional in-person retreat on Dec 22**.

This club is not only a chance to connect with other teens passionate about solving real-world problems, but it is also a chance to strengthen your resume, earn cash prizes, gain access to exclusive internships around the world, and even compete for a trip to the **Global Youth Institute in Iowa**. As this club wraps up, 4-H Educators will even help you write a "global challenge paper" - a paper that focuses in on one of the issues that matters most to you and outlines some of your ideas/solutions to solving that issue around the world. Once complete, the paper will serve as your FREE entry ticket to the Maryland Youth Institute on **April 25th, 2025**.

The Maryland Youth Institute, held every spring at the University of Maryland Eastern Shore's main campus, is an all-day FREE event where teens present their global challenge research papers, meet with food security experts, and participate in a hunger-related service project together. Outstanding participants may earn cash prizes, recognition as Borlaug Scholars, and opportunities to attend the Global Youth Institute.

During both the virtual club meetings and the in-person institute event, you'll gain skills in research, presentation, and critical thinking, while learning how to make a real impact on food security.
