National 4-H Conference

Each year Maryland 4-H sends a small Delegation of outstanding senior-age (14-18) 4-H youth to the National 4-H Conference in the Washington, DC area. Delegates

are selected by a panel of judges who review the applicant's 4-H Portfolio and conduct an interview with the applicant.

Each county/city 4-H program may nominate 4-H youth members to represent Maryland 4-H at National 4-H Conference. **To be nominated, the 4-H'er must submit a Delegate Application, through 4-H Online, by November 15, 2025**.

To be considered, a 4-H youth member must:

- Be between the ages 14-18 as of January 1, 2026.
- Be enrolled in 4-H by their local program deadline.
- Submit a 4-H Portfolio for evaluation.
- Be nominated by the local 4-H Educator (based on 4-H Portfolio).
- Participate in a Delegate interview.

4-H members may serve as Delegates for a total of three leadership trips in their 4-H career. Senior 4-Hers may attend each leadership trip only once and may serve as a Delegate for only one leadership trip each program year. Maryland State Council

The Maryland 4-H State Council is now accepting 2026 General Membership applications.

The Maryland 4-H State Council is the premier teen leadership opportunity in the Maryland 4-H program. It is comprised of active 4-H members from around the state interested in developing high-level leadership skills and representing their local 4-H program.

State Council members have opportunities to gain experience from each other, volunteers, and faculty/staff outside of their club and local 4-H Program. The State Council is led by a youth officer team and faculty/staff advisors. State Council members serve for the full 4-H (calendar) year.

Eligibility

4-H members who will be ages 13-18 as of January 1, 2026 may apply to serve on the Maryland 4-H State Council.

How to Apply

4-H members who are interested in serving on the 4-H State Council are strongly encouraged to contact their local 4-H office before applying. Your 4-H county/city program may have additional requirements for applicants, and they may be able to help you with your application.

Applications for the Maryland 4-H State Council are accepted through 4-H Online. To apply, log in to 4-H Online family profile and click on the Events tab. You will see the 4-H State Council Application portal on the Events page. You may also click on this link (https://2026SCApplication.4honline.com) for direct access to the application portal.

4-H members who apply to serve on the 4-H State Council must submit a cover letter, 4-H resume, and photo. You will upload these items to your application in 4-H Online, in addition to answering a few questions.

You can find an Event Registration "how to" guide on the <u>Maryland 4-H website</u>. You can also contact your local 4-H office for assistance with preparing and submitting your 4-H State Council membership application.

All applications must be submitted in 4-H Online by 11:59 p.m. on November 15, 2025.

Your 4-H Educator must review and approve your application before forwarding it to the State 4-H Office for consideration.

Electronic 4-H Record Books

If you plan to do a Record Book for this year, you will have the opportunity to submit an electronic record.

What is a 4-H Record Book? A 4-H Record Book is a standard record of your activities in 4-H - your projects, activities, events, skills development and learning experiences. The 4-H Record Book helps improve your skills in record keeping and goal management.

The electronic record uses the ZSoft Suite. You will be able to make, edit, and share electronic record books.

To start using the electronic records tool, you will need to create a household, and add yourself as a member of that household, like 4-H Online.

When you go to the website, please click on "Sign Up" on the right-hand side of the screen. From there, please follow the steps outlined in this help document section that goes over how to create a household and add members to that household:

Please note that club members are the only profiles that can make and edit record books. The Primary Account and any subsequent parent/volunteer/leader can view the books but cannot work/edit them.

Electronic Record Books are an option for this year to complete your Record Book. You are still welcome to complete a paper copy instead.

4-H hopes to fully roll out access to the electronic record books on November 1, 2025, for club members and their families.


