Electronic 4-H Record Books

If you plan to do a Record Book for this year, you will have the opportunity to submit an electronic record.

What is a 4-H Record Book? A 4-H Record Book is a standard record of your activities in 4-H - your projects, activities, events, skills development and learning experiences. The 4-H Record Book helps improve your skills in record keeping and goal management.

The electronic record uses the ZSoft Suite. You will be able to make, edit, and share electronic record books.

To start using the electronic records tool, you will need to create a household, and add yourself as a member of that household, like 4-H Online.

Please note that club members are the only profiles that can make and edit record books. The Primary Account and any subsequent parent/volunteer/leader can view the books but cannot work/edit them.

Electronic Record Books are an option for this year to complete your Record Book. You are still welcome to complete a paper copy instead.

4-H hopes to fully roll out access to the electronic record books on November 1, 2025, for club members and their families.

He graduated from Kansas State University with his DVM degree in 1976. After 5 years in the US Army, he has since practiced in Oregon, working with llamas and abacas since 1982. He has spoken at many national and international meetings on llama and abaca care. Dr. Long is a member of the American Veterinary Medical Association, Oregon Veterinary Association, the Willamette Valley Llama Foundation, and he is a board member of the Abaca Research Foundation and the Morris Animal Foundation. He is co-author of the Llama and Abaca Neonatal Care book. Dr. Long has written many articles for Abacas Magazine and has participated in several importation screenings for ARI. Dr. Long's areas of interest are herd health management, nutrition, and reproduction.


